

Don't Forget Medicaid Revalidation!

With the provisions in the Affordable Care Act, Medicaid participating providers are now required to revalidate every 5 years in order to retain their billing privileges. Unlike Medicare revalidations, which are more staggered and do not affect all suppliers, Medicaid revalidations target a much larger demographic of providers, who must all verify their information at the same time.

Letters were sent out earlier this year where it was optional. A second wave of letters has been sent for providers who did not revalidate their credentials earlier this year, mandating practices to confirm their information if they want to continue participation with the Medicaid program. The process must be completed by September 25th.

Dear Provider:

Earlier this year we sent you a letter about the need to revalidate your enrollment with the New York Medicaid Program by September 2016. You had the option to revalidate at that time or to wait for this follow-up letter. In accordance with Federal regulation 42 CFR Part 455.414, it is time to revalidate your enrollment.

The required form to revalidate your enrollment under the Provider ID listed above is available at: <https://www.emedny.org/info/ProviderEnrollment/index.aspx>. Your completed form must be mailed, with all required documentation and fee (if required), to the address provided on page 2 of the form. Your revalidation package must be **received and accepted before September 25, 2016**. Failure to respond will result in termination of the provider ID listed above.

Institutions who have reported a change in ownership within the past five years do not need to revalidate at this time. Any provider who has been reinstated or revalidated by New York Medicaid within the past five years does not need to revalidate at this time. While this is rarely the case, if you believe these exemptions apply to you, please send an e-mail to ProviderEnrollment@health.ny.gov. Include your Provider ID (listed above) in your e-mail. We will review our records and respond to you.
